

## SECOND BRIGADE TO MEET IN GAINESVILLE

RESOLUTION TO THIS EFFECT ADOPTED AT OCALA.

The Time Has Not Been Designated, But Will Be Named By Stonewall Camp.

In chronicling the proceedings of the last day's meeting of the Second Brigade, Florida Division, United Confederate Veterans, The Ocala Banner of Friday says:

"The commander suggested that it would be in order to designate the next time and place for holding the next re-union of the brigade.

"Commander Blitch of the Stonewall Camp stated that the time and place for holding the annual reunion had always been left to the general commanding and his staff.

"Comrade Jackson of the Stonewall Camp, in a short but pointed address, extended an invitation to meet in the city of Gainesville.

"Comrade Wilson of Inverness moved that the division accept the invitation to meet in Gainesville, and the Stonewall Camp to fix the time of meeting, suggesting that the time be set at a season of the year when the weather is neither too hot nor too cold.

"Comrade Payne, in the most spirited and vigorous speech of the session, advocated that the time be fixed for the hottest day in July, remarking that the old soldiers who had fought the great battles of the war in the hottest kind of weather ought not to dread a little hot weather at these annual reunions. Comrade Payne then passed on to a paenryric of the old soldier, and poured forth such a limpid flow of eloquence that the commanding officer officially designated him the Demosthenes of the brigade division.

"As some of the members seemed confused as to the counties that composed the Second Brigade, General Long enumerated them, to wit: Baker, Bradford, Suwannee, Alachua, Columbia, Nassau, Duval, St. Johns, Putnam, Levy, Citrus, Hernando, Marion, Hamilton, Sumter, Pasco.

"After a great deal of discussion the following resolution was passed: 'Resolved, That the next meeting of the Second Brigade be held in the city of Gainesville, and that Stonewall Camp name the time of meeting.'
