One is that the officials of the allied countries do not want them to come at this time, when the transportation facilities are strained to their utmost in the complicated task of demobilization and reconstruction. Italy has already officially announced that she would regard a postponement of any influx of American visit ors for the present as a favor, and France has intimated as much through more than one of her spokesmen. But there is a second consideration of forbidding importanceforbidding to the traveler-and that is the danger such a traveler would expose himself to in visiting Europe at a time when contagious diseases are as prevalent as they are abroad just now.
