PLAN TO AID TRADE HERE AND ABROAD.

NATIONAL COUNCIL OF COMMERCE ORGANIZED TODAY.

Washington, Dec. 10.—The organization of the national council of commerce, begun at a meeting held today in the office of Secretary of Commerce and Labor Straus, is expected to prove of far-reaching benefit to the foreign and home trade of the United States. The council is the embodiment of ideas of Secretary Straus whereby it is hoped the commercial world may be brought in closer touch with the departments of the government and utilize their machinery and the valuable information secured by them for the general betterment of trade at home and abroad.

One of the features of the movement is the establishment of a permanent bureau of the council in this city in charge of a capable man who can keep in close touch with the departments that have to do with commercial affairs and advise the various commercial interests of important matters that arise from time to time and affect their welfare.

The president will receive the delegates today, and Secretary and Mrs. Straus will tender a reception to them this evening.

Famous Woman Composer and Pianist.

Mme. Cecile Chaminade, now in this country for the first time on a professional tour, is the most notable woman composer of the time. She was born in Paris, but she does not like city life and dwells with her mother and sister in a charming suburban retreat convenient to the gay metropolis. She has not attempted any heroic single composition, but has written a great number of exquisite songs and piano pieces which are as tuneful as they are original. Mme. Chaminade's ballet music is played by orchestras all over the world, and her lovely songs are sung in a score of languages.

Rescue Work For Poor Children.

Mrs. Frederick Dent Grant and Mrs. Edith Rockefeller McCormick are interested leaders of the child rescue campaign. The purpose of the movement is to take children from institutions and give them homes in private families. The child may be taken on a limited probation, after which it may be legally adopted, or it may be subject to only a limited adoption. This means an education and a start in business when the child reaches maturity. The demand now seems to be for girls.

Aggressive Tactics of Southern Women.

Interspersed with the election returns in New Orleans the night of Nov. 3 the following sentiments were thrown upon illuminated screens and of course attracted much attention: "Two-thirds of the women of New Orleans are taxpayers. Why can they not vote for city officials?" "Taxation without representation is tyranny" is as true in 1908 as in 1776. Women are taxed. Why can they not vote?" "There are 6,000,000 women wage earners in the United States. A square deal demands for them equally with men the right of the ballot." "Women vote in Australia, Great Britain, Denmark, Sweden, Finland. Why not in America?"

How Colorado Women Voted.

For the purpose of seeing women vote at the last national election in Denver the Post of that city sent a party in a big automobile from polling place to polling place. There were in the observation car Rev. Anna H. Shaw of the National American Woman Suffrage association, Miss Laura A. Grigg, public speaker, and Miss Roy Costelloe and Miss Eleanor Rendell, English suffragettes. Many interesting as well as amusing incidents were noted. At one place a man in the waiting line became nervous, and the woman ahead of him courteously exchanged her place for his. A colored woman who couldn't read asked for help in marking her ballot. One of the voters, Mrs. Richard Sophris, ninety-seven years old, went to the polling place in an active manner and gave her name in a clear voice. The voting of every woman was done in an orderly manner. Not a flippant remark was heard from onlookers. One of the judges at a fashionable precinct where women composed 55 per cent of the total registration said that women turn in a heavy vote, and that without persuasion. He added that they always come out early and conduct themselves intelligently. Governor Elect Shafroth of Colorado and Judge Lindsey of the juvenile court in Denver are indebted to the women for the heavy vote they received.
