Col. Harden Reports Favorably.
President W. F. Franklin of the South Florida Deeper Waterways Association informs us that Col. Harden, the government engineer who recently held a public hearing here, has reported favorably on the deepening of the Caloosahatchee river channel to permit vessels of larger channel draught to navigate between the east and west coasts, and that it is now up to the authorities in Washington to make provisions for carrying out his recommendations. Also that \$9,000 was recently awarded to complete the work of dredging, which is now finished except a two mile strip between LaBelle and Ft. Thompson. Capt. O. U. Bye of Tampa, the government district engineer, is now here supervising the work.—Ft. Myers Tropical News.

The German Revolution.

A few days ago the whole world was startled by the news that the Ebert Government of Germany had been overthrown and a royalist regime established at Berlin.

The revolutionary movement was headed by Dr. Wolfgang, who, immediately upon entering Berlin, proclaimed himself Chancellor and, in order to secure popular support, announced to the people that the new Government was truly democratic, would increase productivity and conserve the rights of the working people; however, it was the general belief that the movement was monarchistic and that the claims of democratic purpose, etc., were mere camouflage intended to keep the masses of the people quiet until the monarchists secured a stranglehold on the German nation.

A remarkable feature of the revolution was the fact that it succeeded in taking complete possession of Berlin without firing a single shot.

The revolution was carefully prepared at Dohertitz, near Berlin, where a number of divisions of the old imperial army were stationed; and the plans were quickly executed. Word of the plot reached the Ebert Government only a few hours in advance of the actual revolutionary movement, and it was then too late to take effective measures for its defeat. Following an ultimatum demanding the immediate resignation of the entire Ebert Government the revolutionists marched into Berlin and the old Government forces withdrew without making any resistance. The people of Berlin seemed to look upon the matter without serious concern, and although some paraded the streets with flags and banners, most of the people continued without interruption the pursuit of business or pleasure, patronizing shops, theatres, etc., or performing their business duties as usual, apparently regarding the revolution as of no more consequence than an ordinary street parade.

For a day or two Government leaders in Allied countries were much disturbed over the German situation, particularly as to the effect upon treaty enforcement. Soon however, it became apparent that the so-called revolution was a mere flash in the pan instead of a general conflagration. Ebert and the leaders of the old democratic government refused to compromise or negotiate with its leaders in any way; organized labor started to fight it with strikes; and Hindenburg and other leaders of the old imperial regime repudiated the move and advised the leaders to submit to the Ebert Government. As a result of all this, the revolution ended almost as suddenly as it began and, aside from the fact that several hundred people in different parts of Germany were killed in local disorders out of the uprising, the whole matter is now regarded throughout Germany and the world at large as a huge farce. Reports regarding Kapp, the leader of the movement, are conflicting. One is to the effect that he has committed suicide.

"There have been a large number of verbal and several written applications for positions in our factory, as a result of our advertisement for toothless old women to blow holes, and as it seems that there is an abundance of this kind of help to be had in this neighborhood I think this is an ideal location for such an enterprise. Our macaroni seed are a little late in arriving but we have a large quantity of spaghetti seed on hand. We are still receiving applications for positions in the blowing department and applications should be addressed to me."
