#### PROPOSED CHARTER OF THE CLARO TOBACCO COMPANY.

The undersigned hereby associate themselves together for the purpose of becoming incorporated under the laws of the State of Florida for the transaction of business under and by virtue of the terms of a Charter, which is as follows:

##### ARTICLE I.

The name of this corporation shall be the Claro Tobacco Company, and its principal place of business shall be in the City of Tallahassee, in the county of Leon, in the State of Florida, with such branch offices in the United States of America, as may be determined on by the Board of Directors.

##### ARTICLE II.

The nature of the business to be transacted by this company shall be to plant, grow, cultivate, cure and manufacture tobacco. To export, import and generally deal in leaf and fine cut tobacco, cigars, cheroots and cigarettes. Also to purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, to control, maintain and operate tobacco warehouses, factories, wholesale agencies and depots for curing, storing, manufacture and sale of tobacco, cigars, cheroots, cigarettes and smokers' supplies. To purchase, own, convey, lease, mortgage or exchange, and in every other way deal in real and personal property. To deal in general merchandise. To own, control and operate saw mills and transways. To purchase, own and control stocks in other corporations, and to do and perform such other things as may be necessary or incidental to the proper conduct of the business of this corporation.

##### ARTICLE III.

The amount of capital stock authorized shall be fifty thousand dollars, divided into five hundred shares of the par value of one hundred dollars each. The capital stock of this corporation may be paid for wholly or in part in lawful money of the United States or in property, labor or services at a just valuation to be fixed by the incorporators.

##### ARTICLE IV.

This corporation shall exist forever.

##### ARTICLE V.

The business of this corporation shall be managed by a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and a Board of Directors, to consist of not less than four nor more than seven, the number to be fixed by the by-laws of the company; provided that the office of Treasurer may be filled jointly with any of the other officers of the company by the same person.

The annual meetings of the stockholders shall be held at the offices of the corporation in the City of Tallahassee, Florida, on the first Tuesday of November, at 10 o'clock a. m. The Directors shall be elected by the stockholders in accordance with the provisions of the by-laws. All other officers shall be elected in the manner prescribed by the by-laws.

The Directors shall meet annually immediately upon the adjournment of the stockholders' meeting.

Until the annual meeting, or such special meeting as shall be called under the laws of Florida and under the by-laws of this company, the following named persons shall conduct the business of this corporation.

##### ARTICLE VI.

The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which this corporation can at any time subject itself shall be equal to double the amount of its authorized capital stock.
