January 18, 1912. The Board of Supervisors of Apache County met this day at 9:30 A.M. in special session, present: Joseph Udall, chairman, Fred T. Colter, and David Ortega, members, Sylvester Peralta, sheriff, R.B. Martinez, deputy clerk.

The following application for school land lease was examined and is hereby rejected.

F.M. Cook, Sec.36, T 16 N, R. 24 E.

In the matter of Ed Miller deputy ranger, the clerk was ordered under authority of the board of supervisors to pay the said Ed Miller the sum of \$50.00 out of the expense fund for 20 days service and expense thereto.

The Board new took up, examined, approved and ordered paid the following claims out of the expense fund:
