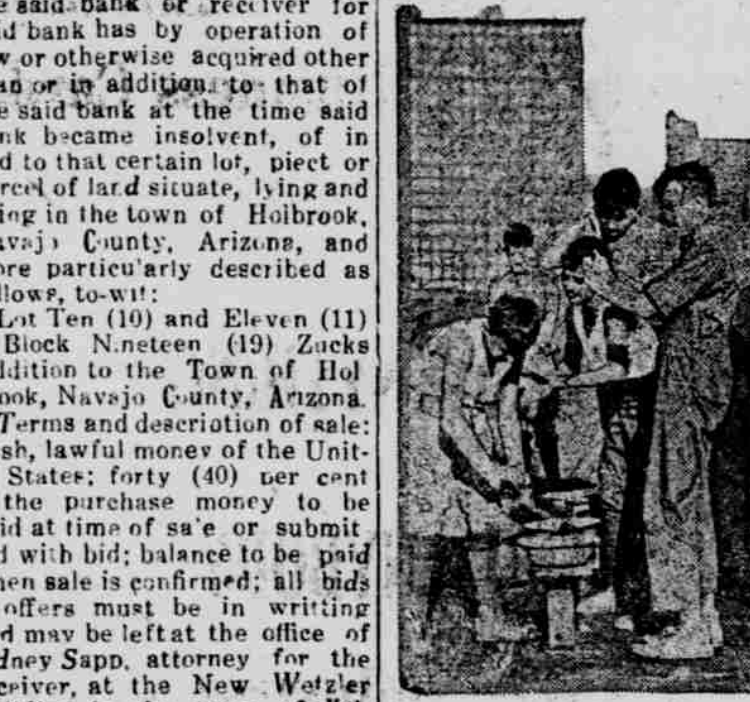

Petrificado's Note Book

A Great deal of fuss is being made around here over the invention of a tickless clock, invented by a German inventor. I do not see anything so wonderful about that. I have known several clocks that would not tick. Why didn't he invent a tickless dog, or a dogless Missouriian, or a homeless brew, or a snoreless husband, a flapperless "Chicken" or a wireless barbed fence? Any one of these would have been really worth while.

We are now stationed at a small village on the "Santa Fe" by the name of AVENA. Avena is a Spanish word which I am told signifies "horse feed" in English. The principal industry here is an almond vacuum cannery, the almonds being brought to this place from the surrounding country which abounds in almond orchards. The raw almonds are brought to the cannery, in very much the same condition one finds them in the East in their Christmas stockings, after their arrival here they are first hulled, then blanched which removes the thin wafery-like skin that envelops the meat, then they are roasted, oiled and salted, which brings them up to the canning process. It is done by a machine that removes the air from the can and seals it at the same stroke. The canning force consists of a fore Lady and several young lady assistants. The fore lady requires all the male employes to wear a cap with the words "Vacuum Packed" in gilt letters on front of cap, which of course refers to the product of the plant and not to the men's heads. I noticed that all of the force are becoming slightly "Almond Eyed". The manager says his plant is the only one of its kind in the United States or any other states. We believe these almonds are destined to fill a long felt Vacuum.
