HIGHWAY CONVENTION TO MEET AT CHATTANOOGA

From present indications the coming convention of Lee Highway Association in Chattanooga January 23 to 25, will be one of unusual interest.

Advices received from Virginia and Tennessee convey the information that delegations are planning to attend. The desire of communities west of Chattanooga to secure the location of this great highway and to have it pass westward through the Memphis gateway is likely to bring delegations from the towns and cities along competing routes.

The convention is to be built around the idea of a strictly business session. The addressees will be given principally by the officials of the organization. A large wall map is being prepared which shows the physical condition of the road at the present time and reveals the localities upon which work must be concentrated. The reports of the various officers and delegations from the different sections will deal with the situation and plans will be formed for construction of all unfinished links.

Special interest centers in the contest for the routing from Chattanooga to Memphis. A year ago the Muscle Shoals Highway Association began its route from Chattanooga through northern Alabama, northeast Mississippi and southwestern Tennessee as Lee Highway, promising to merge their association in Lee Highway Association. Last May the Memphis to Bristol Highway Association

made a similar proposition. In October inspection was made of both routes and the locating committee of Lee Highway Association is giving consideration to the matter and is sounding out the attitude of the various states and counties with a view to ascertaining what may be relied upon by way of quick and permanent construction and proper maintenance along each of these lines. It is the desire of the association to come to a decision as soon as possible. However, full opportunity will be given to each side to present its case and when the decision is made by the full board of directors.

The Board upon considering the bids for the care of the indigent sick found the same to be as follows: Mrs. Alma M. Burns agreeing to care for all indigent patients confined in the County Hospital at a rate of \$3.00 per day, and Mrs. Virginia R. Wilson agreeing to furnish all county indigent patients nursing, medical aid, medicine, surgical dressings, food, bedding and clothing for the sum of \$1.50 per day, the Board after fully considering the said bids by motion duly put and carried accepted the bid of Mrs. Virginia R. Wilson as per the terms heretofore mentioned as outlined in her bids.

O'Bryan & Rawson having submitted the following bid for the burial of indigents that are a county charge, and this being the only bid presented for the burial of indigents, the Board by motion duly put and carried, accepted the same as follows: within a radius of nine miles from the court house of Safford, Arizona, we will furnish a plain pine box, stained, upholstered and with handles, do all work connected with the burial for the sum of \$20.00.

If clothing is desired including underwear, hose and robe and additional charge of \$7.50. Additional distance over nine miles a charge of fifty cents (.50c) a mile for one way. Should the body happen to be at such a place that it couldn't be gotten to with an automobile and there should be extra expense to get it, that expense to be paid by the County of Graham.

This being first regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors in January 1922, the Board proceeded to make a list of all persons within this county qualified and liable to serve jurors for the year 1922, and the Clerk of the Board was ordered to file a certified copy of said list with the Clerk of the Superior Court forthwith; as required by Paragraph 3522, of Chapter 3, Title 36, Revised Statutes of Arizona, 1913, and all acts supplementary and amendatory thereto.

The annual report of the Board of Supervisors, of the indebtedness of the County, of property owned by the County, cash on hand subject to the payment of such indebtedness and rate of taxation for County purposes, for the year ending December 31, 1921 as required by Paragraph 2445, Revised Statutes of Arizona, 1913, having been filed was approved by the Board and the Clerk was ordered to mail a copy of the same to the State Treasurer.

A statement of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, showing in detail the amount, audited and allowed by the Board of Supervisors for services rendered and materials furnished to Graham County, Arizona, for the year 1921, having been filed with the chairman of the Board of Supervisors, the Clerk was ordered to enter the same on the minutes of this meeting, the same being as follows:
