GIVES THEM A ROAST.

The Board of Health Enters the Arena.

The following communication from the board of health of Roanoke city is very much to the point:

Roanoke, Va., Nov. 10th, 1897. The Board of Health reports no recent developed cases of scarlet fever and diphtheria and as far as can be ascertained very few cases, as a whole, have been in the city during this season.

It is much to be regretted that many false and injurious rumors have been ignorantly circulated, but which would never have been the case had all such diseases been promptly reported by the attending physicians and the police justice not have failed to execute the law as entrusted to his keeping and administered it with a fearless, impartial and honest hand.

Trusting that with the co-operation of the city council and mayor that those evils, as far as the law is involved, will in time be remedied, we, in the meantime, assure the public that the alarm now manifested is without foundation, as there are only three cases of diphtheria and two cases of scarlet fever of recent date.
