# BULLER'S PLANS

No Important News From the Seat of War.

NO GAINS ON EITHER SIDE

Light Skirmishing and Reconnoitering, With No important Results, Around Fustenberg-Few Men Were Wounded and Captured by Boers.

London, Feb. 14. - The only war news There is a deal of hard work for the of any kin i this morning is an official dispatch from General Buller at Chieveley announcing a reconnoissance at Springfield, resulting in no gain of ground on either side. Captain Hamilton Russeil, Lieutenant G. Churchill and ten men were wounded and Lieutenant Pilkington and six men were captured by the Boers.

The dispatch contains detailed accounts of what appears to be unimportant operations. They only tend to throw light on the situation by proving that the Boers are actively following General Buller's every move. From Field Marshal Lord Roberts, at Modder river, where all eyes are turned, there




