### Mohave County's New Hospital Opens

There are rooms to care for approximately 32 patients, besides the wards. These rooms are large and commodious, everyone being an outside room. There are besides these rooms sleeping quarters for all help, as well as quarters for the superintendent. In the basement are many rooms that may be used in case of necessity, besides which there is a large sized dining room, boiler and cold storage rooms, etc.

The structure as a whole is a credit to the county and the contractor, J. B. Lammers. Nothing was stinted, everything being of the best. The plumbing is one of the best pieces of work in the state, only the highest class material going into the work. J. P. Gideon will continue as superintendent of the hospital and county farm and Dr. T. R. White is the physician in charge, which portends for the ne whospital economical and honest treatment of not only the county patients but all who may patronize the place. At the present time there are seventeen people in the hospital, fifteen of the patients being other than county patients. Four nurses are in charge of the patients, and it is probable that two more will soon have to be put on, which shows the immediate necessity for such an institution in the county. The people have

On the Gold Dust preparations are going on for the beginning of crosscuts to prove up the work of the diamond drills, and this work is awaited with considerable interest. It is reported that on the 500 level of this mine the drills entered some wonderful ore bodies, but no one appears to know just how good and potential the ore bodies are. The fact that the mine is getting ready to ship ore to the Tom Reed mill is evidence that ore of milling grade has been picked in the new work, although there is a big tonnage of high grade stuff above the 300 level that may be stopped readily.

## HAYDEN VISITS GIRAND'S DIAMOND CREEK PROJECT

(Special Dispatch to the Miner)

Peach Springs, Arizona, July 29.—"I have seen a real power site" said Congressman Carl Hayden on his return from the Colorado River today. "The narrowness of the canyon, the short depth to bed-rock, the solid granite abutments and the proximity to railroad transportation all combine to make it certain that the Diamond Creek site will be used for the creation of hydro-electric energy. I am pleased to have had the opportunity to see this natural resource the development of which means so much to the State of Arizona. I never have heard of any part of the United States that had too much cheap power and am confident that a survey of the situation will demonstrate that an ample market will be found for all of the electric current that can be generated at Diamond Creek and at any other dam which may be constructed by the Federal Government on the lower Colorado River."

Mr. Hayden's trip from Peach Springs to the Colorado River at the mouth of Diamond Creek and return was easily accomplished in one day, although the difference in altitude between the two places is 3,400 feet. The Arizona Congressman was accompanied by James B. Girand of Phoenix who has been at work on the development of this project for the past ten years and who has applied to the Federal Power Commission for a license to build the Diamond Creek power plant. If Mr. Girand's application is granted he will obtain a 50 year lease of this power site at the end of which the Government may take over the power plant and appurtenances by paying for the fair value of the improvements.

The rental to be paid to the United States for the use of the power site is based upon the number of horsepower of electric energy produced. Under the terms of the Federal Water Power Act one half of the lease is to be paid into the Reclamation Fund for the construction of new irrigation projects, 37 per cent to the State of Arizona in lieu of taxes and the remainder into the Federal treasury to defray the expenses of the Federal Power Commission.

Mr. Girand has completed all of the engineering work, has satisfied the Federal Power Commission that the project is feasible and that he has the financial backing necessary to carry it out. The dam in the Colorado River is to be 300 feet high and will produce 200,000 horse power. Seven of the leading copper mining companies of Arizona, in order to avoid the high prices now demanded for coal and fuel oil imported from other states have agreed to immediately advance \$36,000,000 which is the estimated cost of the Diamond Creek dam, the power plant and the necessary transmission lines to various parts of Arizona where the power will be consumed.
