> Mr. Hayden's trip from Peach Springs to the Colorado River at the mouth of Diamond Creek and return was easily accomplished in one day, although the difference in altitude between the two places is 3,400 feet. The Arizona Congressman was accompanied by James B. Girand of Phoenix who has been at work on the development of this project for the past ten years and who has applied to the Federal Power Commission for a license to build the Diamond Creek power plant. If Mr. Girand's application is granted he will obtain a 50 year lease of this power site at the end of which the Government may take over the power plant and appurtanances by paying for the fair value of the

improvements. The rental to be paid to the United States for the use of the power site is based upon the number of horsepower of electric energy produced.
