

Brutality to Prisoners.

COAL HILL, Ark., March 25 .-Governor Hughes and the penitentiary board arrived this afternoon the body, and afford an excellent index to further investigate the brutality of its condition. When the eyes become to convicts in the coal mines. weak, and the lids inflamed and sore, it very brutal. He whipped as many as seventy-five men in one night until the blood ran in streams from their bodies. The place where the convicts were confined is so filthy that a sickening stench comes from it. The beds and blankets were dirty and covered with vermin, and yesterday a lot of shoes and clothing arrived and the men were provided who had gone barefooted all winter. The physicians to-day examined a large number of the convicts whom Gafford had whipped and found their bodies almost solid sores. Men feared to complain while Gafford was here for fear of being beaten again. Some time ago a convict ran off and hid in the mines and refused to come out, and Warden Scott ordered Tom Gaddes, the pit boss, to go down and shoot him. He did so. Things are changed now, but the details of the past acts are sickening and borrible.

The first pension ever granted a Chinaman has been given to Ah Lin, of San Francisco, who on the 4th. of July, 1867, was in the service of the United States navy as Patronize Home Industry! a landsman. While firing a salute on board a vessel in San Francisco bay, the gun exploded and Ah Lin's leg was injured so as to render amputation necessary. His claim for pension was presented but no favorable action could be secured. However, the one-legged Chinaman has been made happy by receiving a pension of \$8 per month with arrearages, which amount to over \$3,000.


