Notice is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria propose to order the improvement of Commercial street from the cost line of Seventeenth street to the west line of Twenty-third street, and Twenty-third street from the north line of Commercial street to Exchange street in that part of the City of Astoria as inid out and recorded by J. M. Shively, said improvement to be known and designated as the "Commercial Street Extension Improvement."


