The Chief Forester.

It is not enough to have an administration of the national forest reserves which is neither partisan or sectional. It should be inspired by the conditions in the regions affected in a vital way. Probably the administration of the forests will be bettered by the change of chief, just as it has been bettered under the late chief's incumbency. Mr. Pinchot created an organization and stamped high ideals upon the personnel. His removal will doubtless cause the forestry issue to overtop the personal issue that ended in the change.

In view of the vast work before the bureau of forestry it might be better to have the chief always "on the spot" as well as "on the job." The office is a subordinate one, and about a year ago an important part of the administrative work was removed from Washington to "the field." Where the most important work is there the chief should be in order to act from a practical viewpoint as well as with practical knowledge.

Until the various states come into line with practically uniform legislation, conforming to that of the general government, the best effects of such legislation as the pure food law cannot be hoped for.

Neighboring Central American republics have recognized Madrid as president of Nicaragua, but Madrid would be better satisfied if he could secure such recognition from one Juan Estrada.
