PEACE TREATY RATIFIED.

Administration's Policy Upheld by the

Washington, Feb. 7.-The treaty of peace negotiated between the commis-sioners of the United States and Spain at Paris was ratified yesterday by the United States senate, the vote being 57 ayes to 27 nays, or one vote more than the two-thirds majority necessary to secure senatorial concurrence in a treaty document. The vote was taken in executive session, and until the injunction of secrecy was romoved the result was supposed to be private. But the vice president had no more than announced the figures before senators rushed out of every door leading from the senate chamber, declaring that the treaty had been ratified. Some made the mistake of stating that there were three votes to spare. There was in fact only one vote more than was necessary -the balloting resulting 57 ayes to 27 nays.
