## FEAR SHIP AND CREW ARE LOST

NO TRACE CAN BE FOUND OF SHIP WHICH WAS IN COLLISION.

Duluth, Dec. 16.—While being towed to Duluth by the wrecking steamer Manistique, the steamer Ireland came into collision and was disabled. The tug George Crosby, which was assisting the Manistique, took the crew off the Ireland and in doing so one man was lost. The Crosby came into Bayfield and reported the loss of one life and returned to look for the Manistique, but at a late hour reports she is unable to find any trace of the Manistique and fears she and her crew of thirty-one men are lost. There is a heavy sea running near Bayfield and the Ireland, which is at anchor near Apostle island, is also in danger.

## FINDS LITTLE TO CRITICISE.

Public Examiner Kerst Files Biennial Report.

St. Paul, Dec. 16.—In his biennial report to the governor, filed yesterday, Public Examiner P. M. Kerst reports the state institutions and departments, county offices and the state banks generally in a very favorable condition. Some criticisms of methods and practices now pertaining are made, but the general tone of the report is favorable so far as these offices are concerned. With reference to the gross earnings tax imposed upon the railroad, express and telephone companies and the methods by which the correctness of the reports of such companies must be checked up the examiner recommends some changes.

## FIREBUG NEARLY MURDERER.

Saloonkeeper Narrowly Escapes Death in Incendiary Blaze.

North Prairie, Minn., Dec. 16.—Emmett Cassidy almost lost his life in a fire which destroyed the building in which he conducted a saloon and used the upper story as a dwelling. Cassidy was asleep in the building when the fire broke out, and when neighbors finally succeeded in arousing him he made his escape with the utmost difficulty. The building and contents were entirely destroyed, causing a loss estimated at \$3,000.

## IS MADE INSANE BY WEALTH.

Mrs. Celestine Andrinne May Return to Hospital.

Fergus Falls, Minn., Dec. 16.—Information of insanity was filed in the probate court here against Celestine Andrinne, one of the wealthiest women in this county.

Mrs. Andrinne was an inmate of the hospital once before. Her husband died several years ago, leaving her a goodly estate, and worry over her fortune is supposed to be the prime cause of her mental derangement.

## WILL BLOOD FLOW AGAIN?

Logging Company Prepares to Move the Logs Which Dietz Guards.

Winter, Wis., Dec. 16.—The Mississippi River Logging company has commenced arrangements to haul the 20,000,000 feet of logs held up by John F. Dietz at Cameron dam to the Chippewa river in order to drive them to its sawmill at Chippewa Falls.

This will probably bring the long and hotly contested fight between Dietz and the company to a close.

## BURNED TOWN WANTS WATER.

Special Election to Vote Bonds is Called at Battle Lake.

Fergus Falls, Minn., Dec. 16.—The disastrous fire which swept away a considerable portion of the business section of Battle Lake a few weeks ago has induced that village to take steps to prevent the recurrence of such a calamity, and a special election has been called by the council for Dec. 26 to vote on the question of issuing bonds to the extent of \$8,000 for the construction of a water works system.

## Cannot Thresh Their Grain.

Bridgewater, S. D., Dec. 16.—Farmers in this vicinity have avoided the trouble experienced by many who cannot ship their grain because of the car shortage by postponing their threshing until next spring. Less than one-third of the threshing has been done.

## Meets Death on Eve of Wedding.

St. Paul, Dec. 16.—Edward Dawson was killed in the railway yards last night. He was engaged to Miss Ella Peler, and soon was to be married. He was working in the Great Northern yards and was struck by a train of empty cars.

## Light Plant Burns.

Cannon Falls, Minn., Dec. 16.—The Cannon Falls electric light plant burned yesterday. This is little short of a calamity, for the city is now left in darkness. It is doubtful if the plant will be rebuilt this winter.

## Balking Mule Is Fatal.

Aurora, Minn., Dec. 16.—The sudden bolting of a balky mule in the Mohawk mine caused the death of John Altmari, a muleteer. He was caught between the car and the mine timbers and crushed to death.

## No Fuel; University Closes.

Seattle, Wash., Dec. 16.—The University of Washington closed its doors yesterday on account of the coal famine from which the city is suffering. It is not known when the classes will be resumed.

## In Danger.

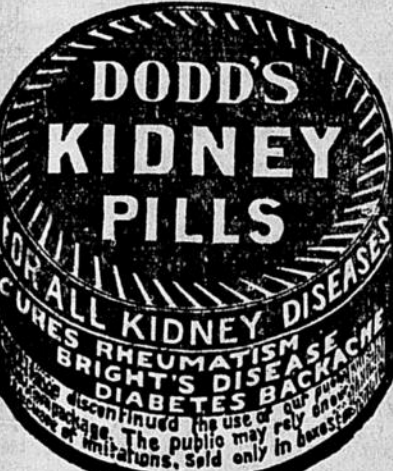
"I have often stood in a slaughter house," observed the fleshy man from Chicago, "while the butchers were killing hogs on all sides of me."
