Poultry Pointers

Feed at regular hours and the fowis will always be ready and waiting for their last meal.

Put the windows in the poultryhouse low down near the floor, so that the hens will get the benefit of the light and sunshine when scratching for their feed.

The chaff that settles beside the straw stack at threshing time makes a splendid winter litter in which to feed the small grain. Have it about six inches deep all over the hen-house

All perches in the poultry-house should be built on a level. When built one above another, step-fashion, the hens will fight for the higher perches with the result that some of them will become injured or eggs will be broken

Grit or lime is absolutely necessary for egg production. It is always well to have a large pile of sand and gravel handy, where the fowls can help themselves.


