## Machinery Hall at Panama Exposition a Gigantic Palace

The Palace of Machinery at the Panama-Pacific International exposition is the largest wooden building in the world today, and, as far as can be discovered, the largest that ever existed in the world.

An idea of its immensity may be gathered from a view down one of its main aisles, in which are now stored some of the gigantic pieces of statuary that will decorate the exhibit palaces when they are sufficiently far advanced to receive them. This statuary is made from models by leading sculptors. In the accompanying illustration is shown the head of the elephant that will represent India in the group, "Nations of the East." Its size may be realized by comparison with the man standing alongside of it. The elephant will carry a howdah on its back, the whole figure being forty-two feet high. To the right of the elephant's head are other details of sculpture, such as the "Mongolian Horseman" and the upper half of the African servant, both of which figures will be in the "Nations of the East." The elephant is by Frederick C. R. Both, the horseman by Leo Lentelli and the African by A. Stirling Calder, these three being the sculptors of the entire group. The nude figure in the rear is a detail of the group, "Spring" by Elio Piccirilli. One of the elephant's legs is shown at the left, behind the freight car. The exposition railway system has branches into all the exhibit palaces, to expedite both work and the installation of exhibits.

**Exposition Notes.**  
The Irish section of the Panama-Pacific International exposition has been allotted 16,000 square feet and it is intended to have a representative exhibition of Irish linen, woollens, laces, silks, poplins, tapestries and textiles generally. The section will have the title "Shamrock Isle." And the wonderful products of the Irish handicrafts will be elaborately displayed. A serious and earnest attempt to show what Ireland produces and makes for sale will be made. Specimens of the old bog-oak furniture will be shown.  
One of the most attractive features of the display in the department of transportation at the Panama-Pacific International exposition in San Francisco in 1915 will be the motorboat exhibits. This will be in the marine section and will include many of the latest types of motor-boats and their engines and equipment. While some of these will be displayed in the Palace of Transportation, others will be seen afloat in the yacht harbor or in the Bay of San Francisco itself.  
Rates for meals served on the grounds of the Panama-Pacific International exposition in San Francisco will be reasonable. Each concessionaire will be under contract with the exposition to provide everything on bills of fare at agreed prices. The restaurants and cafes on the grounds will cater to all tastes, and will range from those with simple, inexpensive menus to those with dishes on a par with the best in the world's largest cities, but at fair prices. Several restaurants will provide dinners at 50 cents. Others will serve meals a la carte and their patrons will pay as much or as little as they like.
