

Machinery Hall at Panama Exposition a Gigantic Palace

The Palace of Machinery at the Panama-Pacific International exposition s the largest wooden building in the world today, and, as far as can be discovered, the largest that ever existed in the world.

An idea of its immensity may be gath-

ered from a view down one of its main aisles, in which are now stored some of the gigantic pieces of statuary that will decorate the exhibit palaces when they are sufficiently far advanced to receive This statuery is made from them. models by leading sculptors. In the accompanying illustration is shown the head of the elephant that will represent India in the group, "Nations of the East." Its size may be realized by comparison with the man standing alongside of it. The elephant will carry a howdah on its back, the whole figure being forty-two feet high. To the right of the elephant's head are other details of sculpture, such as the "Mongolian Horseman" and the upper half of the African servitor, both of which figures will be in the "Nations of the East." The elephant is by Frederick G. R. Roth, the horseman by Leo Lentelli and the African by A. Stirling Calder, these three being the sculptors of the entire group. The nude figure in the rear is a detail of the group, "Spring" by Furio Pic cirilli. One of the elephant's lega is shown at the left, behind the freight car. exposition railway system has branches into all the exhibit palaces, to expedite both work and the installation of exhibits.
