WHERE ARE WE

At, in the Liquor Business?

Attorney Kittredge and

Mayor Daniels Get To-

gether--What'll

You Have?

The hearing of the three liquor cases yesterday brought to this city A. B. Kittredge, Esq., attorney of the brewers of Sioux Falls, to defend the accused. The defendants avoided trial and gave bonds, the object being to await the decision of the supreme court in a similar case carried up from another county. In a conversation with Mayor Daniels, Mr. Kittredge pointed out the futility of such prosecutions, as the brewing companies have taken counsel with the best lawyers both in Dakota and in the east and all are agreed that there is no law in South Dakota governing the liquor traffic. Mr. Kittredge suggests to the mayor of this and all other cities that they put in effect the old license law of last year and thus control the traffic, receive revenue therefrom and at the same time afford protection to the city and to the liquor men. The latter prefer to run under the old plan and are ready to pay their license a year in advance and ask no rebate if at the end of six months the supreme court decision should be received and it be against them, but which they are thoroughly satisfied will not be. Mayor Daniels is inclined to think that Mr. Kittredge's suggestion is about the best thing to follow, looking at the situation from a business and legal standpoint, but if the friends of temperance desire that he shall go on and fight the open saloon he is prepared to do that. He will call a meeting in a few days to determine the wishes of the friends of good government in the matter, and be governed by their desire.

The Chautauque management received a telegram from Chicago this afternoon stating that Eugene V. Debs would arrive here on the 12th inst. to fill his appointment, having been detained on account of illness.
