 Believe Balkans Bluffing

 LONDON, Jan. 28.—The Balkan envoys today formally handed the Turks a joint note, declaring that the allies will immediately terminate the armistice unless Turkey makes a conciliatory move forthwith.
 It is believed that the Turkish envoys will ask for more time in which to consult the cabinet at Constantinople.
 Diplomats of many nations who have been watching the faction in the Balkan countries are of the opinion that the allies are bluffing in their threat to resume hostilities at once.
 It is believed that the Balkan allies are no more able to afford the resumption of fighting than is Turkey.

 You are, therefore, further notified that the said allegations will be taken by this office as having been confessed by you, and your said entry will be canceled thereunder with-

out your further right to be heard therein, either before this office or on appeal, if you fail to file in this office within twenty days after the FOURTH publication of this notice, as shown below, your answer under oath, specifically meeting and responding to these allegations of contest, or if you fail within that time to file in this office due proof that you have served a copy of your answer on the said contestant either in person or by registered mail.
