**WILSON OUTLINES PLAN CAMPAIGN**

**EUREKA BOOSTER IS IN THE CITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF INTERESTING PEOPLE IN NEW RAILROAD**

Klamath Falls will co-operate with Eureka, Calif., in efforts to rush the construction of the Hill line through this city to the coast. This was the assurance given Rufus Rockwell Wilson at the meeting of the Chamber of Commerce last night.

Mr. Wilson explained his plan in detail last night, and was well received. In fact there was enthusiasm when he explained the possibility of the road's construction was probable.

According to the route mapped out by the Eureka boosters it is less than 300 miles from this city to the metropolis of Humboldt, and the grades are said to be favorable for railroad building. It is the plan for the line to pass from here to Yreka and from that city to Eureka.

A number of interesting addresses were made at the meeting last night. Notable among these was one by E. B. Hall, who declared that he was not a talker, but very fond of work. The speaker asked that Mr. Wilson outline some plan of campaign and assured him that when this was done the Klamath Falls boosters would co-operate.

Mr. Wilson then asked that a live committee be appointed to act with a similar committee from the Eureka commercial organization. The naming of the committee was postponed for a few days.

Burrell Short returned to his ranch in the Miller Hill district today, highly elated after attending Wednesday's dairymen's meeting.

E. R. C. Williams, who resides on the Midland road, attended the dairymen convention, and transacted business in the county seat Wednesday.

**TAFT ADVOCATES GOVERNMENT LINE**

**IN SPECIAL MESSAGE HE RECOMMENDS FEDERAL RAILROAD TO OPEN THE UNDEVELOPED ALASKAN COAL FIELDS**

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 6.—In a special message to congress delivered today, President Taft recommends construction by the government of 733 miles of railroad in Alaska. The cost is estimated by the executive at \$35,000,000.

According to the plan outlined by Taft, this road would open the Behring and Matanuska coal fields. He advises private operation of the railroad under a lease.

**COUNTY COURT ALLOWS BILLS**

**SHORT SESSION HELD THURSDAY, AT WHICH TIME CLAIMS AGAINST THE COUNTY WERE ACTED UPON**

A short session of the county court was held Wednesday afternoon, which was conducted by County Judge Wenden and Commissioner John Hagelstein. The session was held for the purpose of acting upon a number of claims against the county, and warrants were ordered drawn in several instances.
