STRANGE OREGON MINERALS

Silicate of Nickel Found Only in Two Places

Douglas county, Oregon, has the distinction of being one of two places in the world where silicate of nickel, one of the most valuable of minerals is found. In the interesting display which the county has made at the Lewis and Clark Exposition there are a number of specimens of the mineral, Silicate of nickel is green in color, and looks like corroded copper. It contains 12 per cent nickel, worth from eleven to thirteen cents per pound. The greatest quantity of silicate of nickel comes from the island of New Caledonia, off the coast of Australia, where there is whole mountain of the mineral.

Douglas county also has the distinction of being, so far as is known, the only place in America where bamboo is raised. Several bamboo trees, twenty-four feet high, are exhibited at the fair, and they have attracted great interest. Bamboo grows from the stalk, like asparagus, dying down each year. The growth is remarkably rapid, as is attested by the twenty-four foot trees shown at the fair, which are not exceptionally high. In Douglas county many people have bamboo trees in their yards, but as yet it is not being raised for commercial purposes, Needless to say, no one need go without a fish pole in the Southern Oregon county.
