Now Jim is a good hearted fellow. He readily comprehended that a large horse could not be crammed into the space that would exactly be filled by a small cuyaton. He also saw a man without cash could do nothing and as the goods looked good to him, he ventured to ask the price, and was informed that \$3 would make him the owner of the property. 
