DROWNED IN FLOOD OF BOOZE

London, Dec. 14 .- Through the bursting of a tank containing 40,-000 gallons of liquid "draff" or malt refuse, the foundations of another tank containing 30,000 gallons of hot fermenting spirit were carried away and in the flood of liquor following one man lost his life and 14 have been injured in a Glasgow distillery belonging to the Distiller's

Company, Limited. The tanks were in a tower; the weight of the spirit burst the walls, and the liquid fell in an overwhelming shower on the men in the "draff" house on the ground floor, who were preparing "draff" with which to load the farmers' carts which were standing outside.

The men escaped suffocation by being washed into the street.

The spirit, which had a temperature of 80 degrees, poured into the street like a tidal wave, and rose to such a height that it left its mark on 1500 Lbs. Tea, Japan, not exceeding the first story of the buildings oppo-
