Of late he has become an enthusiastic automobilist, and it is possible that he may decide to enter the ranks of professional racing car drivers.

Gans is now 33 years of age, and has been a professional fighter for 14 years. He retires the undisputed lightweight champion, with none in sight to dispute his claim to the title.
