Diphtheria at Asylum— Owing to the fact that one patient and two nurses are suffering from diphtheria at the State Asylum, the institution has been quarantined and no visiting will be permitted until the quarantine is lifted. All the cases are of a mild character and it is said that it is only a matter of time until the patients will recover and the disease be stamped out.
