## Oregon's Famous Summer Resorts

### Newport, Cool and Breezy, Draws Visitors From Cities

Newport, Ore., July 22.—With expressions of "the best time ever" heard on every side, the State Druggists' convention came to a close Saturday night and the "pull-rollers" special left at 1:30 Sunday afternoon for Portland.

It was a busy six days that the 250 druggists, representing nearly every town in the state, passed in Newport. Beginning with the departure of the special train from Portland Tuesday morning, there was, as one enthusiastic druggist announced, "something doing every minute."

Upon their arrival in Albany, the druggists were entertained with automobile rides and morning picture shows by businessmen of Albany. They left the hub city at 3 o'clock, arriving in Newport at 7. They were almost immediately ushered into the dining-room of the Abbey hotel, where they were entertained with a delightful banquet. An address of welcome was made by Dr. M. M. Davis and responded to by Dr. W. L. Cottle.

Wednesday morning was passed in a business session, at which time the annual message of the president of the association was read. Some contacts were held in the afternoon on Nye Beach, while in the evening a reception and hall was given in honor of the druggists by the traveling salesmen.

The main feature of Thursday morning's program was the annual baseball game between the druggists and traveling men, which was won by the former. The afternoon exercises included a business session. Several papers, dealing with important pharmaceutical topics, were read and discussed. Reports were made by the officers of the association and officers elected for the ensuing year.

Following the business session came the clam-bake on the bay beach. The affair was most successful in every particular. It was given by the women's auxiliary of the Newport commercial club.

The final business session was held Friday morning and several papers were read. At 11:30 occurred the tug-of-war between the traveling men and the druggists. The latter were the victors. In the afternoon were held foot races and other contests, in which both men and women participated.

Saturday was passed in excursions to the many points of interest, aquatic contests at the naturatorium and a stag social.

An important improvement in the train facilities into Newport was made last week when another Sunday excursion train was placed on the run to this resort. The new train starts from Salem every Sunday morning at 6:15, arriving in Albany at 7:15. A 15-minute stop is made in Albany for breakfast, after which the trip to Newport is continued, reaching here at 12:25 p. m. After allowing the excursionists six hours at the seaside, the train leaves at 6 o'clock for Albany, where it connects with the Salem special, which arrives in Salem at 11:51 p. m.

This latest improvement is but one of the things that the Southern Pacific

has done to improve the railroad service into Newport. A week ago a sleeper was placed on the run between Newport and Portland, leaving the latter city Saturday and arriving here Sunday. This has proven a great convenience to Portland people who desire to pass the week-end at the beach.
